Hodges Pond south bridge opens.

Under the guidance of Upper Thames River Conservation Authority, Paul Brown and Sons Excavating recently completed the installation of the south bridge over Cedar Creek on this increasingly popular trail. It's just part of the work needed to make it into an accessible loop trail including surface improvements, an information kiosk, possibly an interpretive centre and a larger carpark. This latest work builds on earlier projects that have improved the once derelict ecosystem into a wonderful habitat for aquatic species, birds, plants and mammals, both two and four legged.

When using trails during the winter months please use appropriate foot ware, preferably insulated with high grip soles. Strap-on crampons improve grip on ice and snow and reduce the possibility of slip and fall.
